

COMPOSTING & RECYCLING PROGRAM CHECKLIST

Use this checklist to ensure your compost & recycling programs are set up for success.



Avoid contamination fees and missed collections by reviewing your programs **every** year.

HOW TO SET UP YOUR DISPOSAL AREA

Avoid additional fees from contamination and missed collections by following these steps:

Containers are stickered Ensure all containers are stickered with their appropriate labels.

Equal access to all three streams Make sure all three containers (recycling, compost, and landfill) are next to each other and equally easily accessible for resident use.



* all compost containers will be changing from brown to green

Check that signage is posted near/behind the containers.



- **Issues with containers** If there are any broken or vandalized containers, please contact Napa Recycling for replacements.

Always keep your containers "married" so that recycling, landfill, and compost are next to each other and not separated.

We take pride in creating a clean and healthy environment for everyone in Napa (& beyond) and you can help by recycling and composting correctly. Your property manager should gift you with a free recycling basket or bag. If not, reach out to them to inquire for one!



ON'T BAG RECYCLARDING

Why is it important to compost and recycle correctly?

- Saving our natural resources,
- Reducing waste from our landfills,
- Providing jobs to community members,
- Keeping recycling workers safe, and
- Supporting a healthy environment for future generations.

Doing it Right: Make sure your efforts don't go to waste by remembering these simple rules:

- Know what goes where. Visit naparecycling.com to learn more.
- **Empty & clean** recyclables before placing them in the recycle bin (use 3 seconds of water total and put the lid back on!).
- **Don't bag recyclables!** Place loose recyclables into the bin.
- Dirty and soiled (and cheap) paper belongs in compost. Remember, anything that was ever alive - plant or animal! - goes into your compost cart.







TIP

The symbol does **NOT** always indicate that an item is recyclable. Double check if an item is recyclable at http://www.naparecycling.com





COMPOSTING NOW AVAILABLE!

Dear Enter Complex Name Resident,

We are pleased to announce our new composting program. We are excited to help the environment and local Napa Community by reducing our landfill waste and creating a product that is used to help regenerate our soil and food sources!

Why is composting important? Composting helps the environment by:

- Saving our natural resources,
- Reducing waste from our landfills,
- Supporting a healthy environment for future generations, and
- Creating new life.



Collect food scraps while preparing meals, scraping plates, and/or cleaning out the refrigerator of spoiled food. Include paper towels, napkins, paper plates and coffee cups.



Empty your kitchen compost pail, including a certified compostable liner/paper liner/or soiled paper, into your brown or green compost cart.



We'll take it from here! We haul your compost to our facility and within 60 days, we make rich compost that is used throughout the community and beyond to help regenerate the soil!



Remember anything that was ever alive - plant or animal - can be composted in your curbside compost cart! Check out <u>naparecycling.com</u> for more information.



HOW TO RECYCLE AND COMPOST





Plastic bags jam sorting equipment and can cause the entire recycling facility to shut down. Do **NOT** put recyclables in plastic bags! Use a reusable bag or bin to carry out and empty recyclables directly into the cart.

RECYCLING

Rigid plastic, aseptic cartons, metal, **clean** paper and cardboard, and glass





COMPOST

all food (beans, rice, dairy), soiled paper (paper towels, waxed paper), yard trimmings (leaves, grass, hair)





LANDFILL

plastic bags & wrappers, Styrofoam, ceramics, hoses, and dog & cat poop







8 ITEMS THAT DO NOT BELONG IN THE RECYCLE or COMPOST BIN

DID YOU KNOW?



Over 20 people hand sort the recycling alongside about \$15 million worth of equipment to get it "clean" enough/ free of contamination to be able to recycle it because of it being so contaminated. When in doubt, find out!

These items are often mistakenly put in the recycle bin. Learn how to properly dispose of them!

LANDFILL

Throw away in the landfill cart.

PLASTIC BAGS & WRAP



Plastic bags get caught in and jam recycling sorting machines, halting the entire recycling process.

STYROFOAM



Styrofoam packaging is not recyclable due to its fragile state. Currently there is not an available market for recycling it. Please consider reusing Styrofoam whenever possible.

DOG & CAT



Dog and cat poop belong in the landfill container due to the pathogens that they have in the stomach, making their feces not compostable.

TEXTILES/CLOTHES

CLOTHES



Clothes/textiles cannot be recycled in your blue recycling cart. They can be recycled/downcycled by donating them to a non-profit or using our Recycle More program.

DROP-OFF

multiple locations naparecycling.com

The items below **CANNOT** be thrown in the landfill or recycling

BATTERIES



Batteries are hazardous waste and can cause a fire in our trucks and/or facility if disposed of incorrectly.

OLD PAINT



Old paint is recycled through the Paint Care program which turns it into new paint. Check: naparecycling.com/paint

ELECTRONIC WASTE



Electronic waste must be recycled separately due to the large number of hazardous components that must be removed for separate treatment.

FLUORESCENT LIGHTBULBS



Fluorescent lightbulbs have mercury in them and so must beproperly dismantled to ensure the safety and welfare of everyone.









5 ITEMS THAT CAN BE DROPPED OFF AT THE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY

Moving or getting rid of stuff? The Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 889A Devlin Road is a one stop drop-off for a variety of household items. Open Friday-Saturday from 9am – 4pm

PAINT



Recycle old paint with PaintCare! You can recycle unwanted house paint, primer, stain, or varnish for free. Both latex and oil-based products are accepted. Additional drop off locations found on our website.

FLUORESCENT LIGHTBULBS



Fluorescent lightbulbs have mercury in them and so must be disposed as hazardous waste. Up to 4 feet accepted, free of charge.

HOUSEHOLD CLEANERS & PESTICIDES



Some household cleaners can release toxic gases in certain circumstances and thus require professional disposal.

SMOKE DETECTORS



Smoke detectors have radiation in them and so must be disposed as hazardous waste.

MEDICATION



Please dispose of old or unused medication at drop off locations. Never flush it down the toilet or dispose of it in your curbside carts.

SELF-HAUL OR BULKY ITEM PICK UP

MATTRESS & BOXSPRING



Drop off one mattress and box spring set for free at the Devlin Road Transfer Station. One set per visit. Or schedule a curbside bulky item pick up, for a fee.
